

Year 8 Rugby v WHSB - STM 15 – 45 WHSB - Having already been rearranged, this much anticipated fixture had a slow start with both teams missing a number of boys due to the U13 Essex trials. STM started well with some good attacking phases but an unforced knock-on landed at the feet of WHSB's winger who had enough gas (and more!) to get around the outside of our disorganised defence. This set the tone for much of the next 5-10 minutes for STM, with some heads dropping and poor skill execution, WHSB stormed into the lead and went into half-time with a secure lead.
