#### **Dear Parents and Pupils**

We have recently been reviewing many aspects of school life and have sought the views of students, parents, staff and Governors and the feedback has been very useful in helping school improvement. Over the next few weeks we will be sending out information about a move to cashless catering in response to students views about school catering, further improvements in our communication between home and school in response to parental feedback which are to include a new Student Planner, website and VLE and a change to the timings of lessons during the school day which have arisen from staff and student feedback.

The start and end of the school day remain the same - 8.40am and 3.30pm but a slightly extended break will allow possibilities of developing the range of food on offer at breaktime, when most students consume their lunch and still allow plenty of time for the extensive range of lunchtime clubs. These timings will also enable us to launch our Sport Academy in the Sixth Form from September, thereby increasing the involvement of Sixth Form teams in local, regional and national competitions. In order to ensure this runs smoothly in September we are to trial these timings for two weeks starting on 7th July.



Year 10 Science Double Award Groups - Now that the year 10 Core science GCSE course is finished pupils are moving onto the year 11 science GCSE which is titled "Additional Science". As mentioned in the email letter that went out to all parents concerned last week, we are starting this course off now by focusing pupils on the first part of a

controlled assessment task (ISA). On the 10<sup>th</sup> July pupils will be sitting their <u>paper 1</u> exam and all the work that is being done in class leading up to the 10<sup>th</sup> will help prepare them for this exam. It is important that they prepare at home as well especially while they are away on work experience. To help prepare themselves at home we advise that they should use the module 2 ISA material on our "science GCSE – controlled assessment resources" VLE page.

The science ISA tasks contribute 25% of the marks for the course and so it is important that they prepare as much as is possible. ## PE DEPARTMENT NEWS

**STM National Schools Athletics -** Our Junior Athletics squad travelled to Lee Valle Athletics Stadium in London last Thursday, on a lovely summer's dayThe junior squad has performed well in the first round of the competition but were unsure what to expect at the regional level, where they would be up against some of the strongest athletes in Cambridge, Hertfordshire and Essex.

Arriving at the venue our boys were amazed at the fantastic facilities and entered via th indoor High Performance Athletics centre, gathering around to look at the picture profiles of some of the United Kingdom's top class athletes (pictured on the right), who had previously competed or trained at the facility. Very inspirational for our aspiring athletes!





The morning's events quickly got underway and it was clear from the start that our boys were doing way more than holding their own; we in fact dominated the track events. There were numerous strong performances from the team but special mentions must go to our biggest point winners on the day:

- Daniel Adebayo who ran 12.4 seconds in the 100m and triple jumped a staggering distance of 11m.80.
- Herbert Zumbika from Year 7 who ran 26.6 seconds for 200m and threw 9.72m in the shot put.
- Chosen James who ran 13.4 seconds in the hurdles and jumped 4.77m in the long jump
  - Isaac Smith who jumped 4.71m and ran 44.6 seconds in the 300m.

There were many notable performances in all areas and it was a strong team

performance all round. The boys delivered event after event throughout the day and the black and white vests were constantly acquiring the top 3 track places. After a nervy wait at the end of the day the results were in, out of the seven regional finalists STM had come second, with a massive score of 434 points, losing out to the Kind Edmund School in Essex by just points! The school are so proud of their achievement in their first year in the competition, 4 more points and it could have been a National Final. Marginal gains! The final results:

- 1: King Edmund School, Essex 437 points.
- 2: St Thomas More School, Essex 434 points
- 3: The Campion School, Essex 433 points
- 4: Brentwood Independent School, Essex 405 points
- 5: Emmerson Park School, Essex 404 points
- 6: Farlingaye High School, Suffolk- 328 points
- 7: The Perse School, Cambridgeshire 311 points.

We were all disappointed but hugely proud of what the boys achieved. It will mean we are ready to come back fighting harder next Year, ensuring we reach a National Final. The team and staff had a great day and the amazing experience was topped off when some of the boys met GB 100m sprinter **Dwayne Chambers** (pictured below with our talented 800m runner Zack Wing).
