Dear Parents and Pupils,

Mobile Phones – Since September, I have received an unprecedented amount of letters from parents requesting, for various reasons, permission for their sons to bring a mobile phone to school. The phone would then be handed in at Reception, to be collected by the student at the end of the school day. As it stands, Reception has become 'home' to nearly 60 mobile phones which, when being collected at the end of the school day, is causing congestion and delay in some students being on time for their transport home.

After careful thought and discussion with my colleagues in the Senior Leadership Team, mobile phones will no longer be kept at Reception. The rules for mobile phones in school remains the same – mobile phones should not be brought into school. The decision to provide your child with a mobile phone to give parents/cares reassurance that they can contact their child whilst travelling alone on public transport or journeys to and from school, is made on the understanding that the mobile should be switched off completely whilst at school, not merely silenced or on divert or vibrate.

In order to reduce the risk of theft or loss during the school day, students who carry mobile phones must keep them concealed, not advertise that they have them, and mark them clearly with their name.

During examinations, we will continue to follow JCQ guidance (as found on the school website).

St Thomas More, the Governing Body and school staff accept no responsibility for students who lose or have mobile phones stolen whilst travelling to and from school.

If a student is seen with, or using a mobile phone on school premises, the phone will be confiscated to a secure place in school and returned at the end of the school day and a letter will be sent home on a first offence. If a student breaks this rule again, the phone will be confiscated to a secure place in school, parents/carers will be informed who then may collect the phone during office hours. Repeated infringements would be seen as a breach of the Student Behaviour Policy and sanctions may follow.

It should be noted that it is a criminal offence to use a mobile phone to menace, harass, or offend another person. The school may consider it appropriate to involve the police if such an event occurs.

I am aware that the majority of us now own a mobile phone and I agree that they are useful tools, but use of them during the school day is not necessary and they can be a catalyst for drawing undesirable attention to their owners. Once the acceptable use policy is approved by governors, we will publish this to parents. It is understood that parents/carers accept this change of practice unless they contact the school directly to express their non-acceptance. I hope that I can have your full support on this matter.

SEN Information Evening – Parents/Carers of students with a Statement of Educational Needs will shortly receive a letter inviting them to a SEN Information Evening on Wednesday 24th September at 6pm. The evening has been designed so that parents can hear about the changes to the SEN Code of Practice for Children with Statements and how we are able to offer specific support to these students.

Please come along if you can as this is a lovely opportunity for parents to meet some of our staff and other parents in a relaxed atmosphere. 11+Examination – This Saturday many Year 6 pupils will be taking the 11+ examination. We shall have a large number of pupils sitting the exam in our school hall. Parents have been requested to arrive between 8.30 and 8.45am. My thanks go to our Parents' Association who will be providing refreshments.
